EXPLANATORY NOTE

The purpose of the Bill is described in the Preamble.

An Act respecting Peterborough General Hospital

Preamble	<p>The Corporation of the City of Peterborough and the board of governors of The Peterborough Civic Hospital have applied for special legislation to change the name of the hospital corporation, its objects, its powers and the composition of its board. The applicants also wish to transfer certain property from the City to the hospital corporation and to transfer any gifts, trusts and bequests made to the City in trust for the hospital.</p> <p>It is appropriate to grant the application.</p> <p>Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:</p>	<p>(a) the persons required by the <i>Public Hospitals Act</i>; and</p> <p>(b) the persons required by by-law, to be chosen in the manner specified by by-law.</p> <p>(3) The term of office of board members described in clause (2) (b) is as specified by by-law.</p> <p>(4) The following persons shall be deemed to hold office under clause (2) (b) on the day this Act comes into force:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Huda Al Haddad, Paul Ayotte, Bernard Blishen, Jane Dudas, John Goodman and Loretta Round (term of office expires on May 31, 1999). 2. Michael McIntyre, Neil Rogers and Dawn Straka (term of office expires on May 31, 2000). 3. Doris Brick, Richard Krug and Kenneth Powell (term of office expires on May 31, 2001). <p>6. (1) Any interest of the City in personal property that is used for the purposes of the hospital corporation immediately before this Act comes into force is transferred to the hospital corporation when this Act comes into force.</p> <p>(2) Subject to subsection (3), a conveyance executed by the City and registered in the appropriate land registry office vests in the hospital corporation all right, title and interest of the City in the lands designated as Parts 1, 13 and 27 on Plan 45R-8944, deposited in the land registry office.</p> <p>(3) The City may reserve an easement over the lands designated as Part 27 on Plan 45R-8944.</p> <p>7. Powers	<p>4. The hospital corporation has the capacity and the rights, powers and privileges of a natural person.</p>		
Board	<p>5. (1) The affairs of the hospital corporation shall be managed by its board.</p>		
Composition	<p>(2) The board of the hospital corporation is composed of,</p>		

Trust property	(3) The hospital corporation is the trustee of property that, before its transfer under this Act, is trust property and following the transfer, the property remains trust property.	8. Upon the dissolution of the hospital corporation, the remaining property of the hospital corporation shall be given to charitable organizations that provide health care in the County of Peterborough. Claims	(4) Claims that may be made by or against the City with respect to property held in trust by the City for the hospital corporation before this Act comes into force may be made by or against the hospital corporation in its place when this Act comes into force.	9.
