## An Act respecting government bills

Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:

#### Information requirements re government bills

- 1 (1) Upon introduction of a government bill, the following information must be tabled in the Assembly:
  - 1. A statement describing the problem that the bill seeks to address.
  - 2. A statement describing the public policy goals that the bill seeks to achieve.
  - 3. A detailed summary of the financial costs that the bill would have on the government, municipalities, the public and any affected industries or businesses.
  - 4. If the effect of the bill would limit competition in the economy, a description of how the public policy goals described in paragraph 2 justify that limit.
  - 5. An assessment of the relationship between the bill and other Ontario legislation.
  - 6. A detailed description of any potential overlap between the bill and existing municipal by-laws or federal legislation.
  - 7. If applicable, a description of how the bill will affect Ontario's competitiveness in the global marketplace.
  - 8. If applicable, a science-based assessment of how the bill will affect the environment or human health.

#### Posting on Assembly website

(2) The information described in subsection (1) must be available on the Assembly website as soon as possible after the bill is introduced.

### Commencement

2 This Act comes into force on the day it receives Royal Assent.

#### Short title

3 The short title of this Act is the Transparency in Government Bills Act, 2017.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The Bill enacts the *Transparency in Government Bills Act, 2017*. The Act requires certain information to be tabled in the Assembly when a government bill is introduced. The information must include, among other things, a statement describing the problem that the bill seeks to address, a description of the public policy goals that the bill seeks to achieve, and a summary of the financial costs that the bill would have on the government, municipalities, the public and any affected industries or businesses.
