Ordered, That, notwithstanding any Standing Order or Special Order of the House, the following arrangements be made with respect to Bill 201, Act to amend the Election Finances Act and the Taxation Act, 2007.

That the Standing Committee on General Government be authorized to meet from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Monday, June 6, 2016, for the purpose of hearing from the Chief Electoral Officer of Ontario, who will be invited to make a presentation of up to two hours, followed by discussion with the Officer moderated by the Chair; and

That the Committee be authorized to meet from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 7, 2016, for the purpose of hearing from the Leader of the Green Party of Ontario, who will be invited to make a presentation of up to one hour followed by discussion with the Leader moderated by the Chair; and

That the Committee be authorized to meet from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 8, 2016, for the purpose of hearing from a witness chosen by the Official Opposition House Leader, who will be invited to make a presentation of up to one hour followed by discussion with the witness moderated by the Chair; and

That the Committee be authorized to meet from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 9, 2016, for the purpose of hearing from a witness chosen by the Third Party House Leader, who will be invited to make a presentation of up to one hour followed by discussion with the witness moderated by the Chair; and

That the Standing Committee on General Government be authorized to meet from 6:45 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 7 and Wednesday, June 8, 2016, for the purpose of public hearings; and

That the deadline to request to appear on these dates be 12:00 noon, Thursday, June 2, 2016; and

That witnesses be scheduled on a first-come first-served basis; and

That all witnesses receive 10 minutes for presentation and 15 minutes of questioning by Committee Members; and

That the Chief Electoral Officer or his designate be invited to attend Committee hearings as an advisor authorized to answer questions posed by members and provide feedback on presentations; and

That the Committee be authorized to meet for up to four weeks during the summer adjournment for the purpose of public hearings; and

That one staff person from each Recognized Party be authorized to travel with the Committee; and

That the Committee be authorized to meet from 12:30 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 1, 2016, for the purpose of organizing hearings during the summer adjournment; and

That the deadline for written submissions be 1:00 p.m. on Monday, August 15, 2016; and

That the deadline for filing amendments with the Clerk of the Committee following public hearings be 4:00 p.m. on Monday, August 22, 2016; and

That the Committee be authorized to meet in Toronto from Monday, August 29 to Thursday, September 1, 2016, from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of clause-by-clause consideration of the bill; and

That at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 1, 2016 those amendments which have not yet been moved shall be deemed to have been moved, and the Chair of the Committee shall interrupt the proceedings and shall, without further debate or amendment, put every question necessary to dispose of all remaining sections of the Bill and any amendments thereto. At this time, the Chair shall allow one 20-minute waiting period pursuant to Standing Order 129(a); and

That the Committee shall report the Bill to the House no later than Monday, September 12, 2016. In the event that the Committee fails to report the Bill on that day, the Bill shall be deemed to be passed by the Committee and shall be deemed to be reported to and received by the House; and

That, upon receiving the report of the Standing Committee on General Government, the Speaker shall put the question for adoption of the report forthwith, and at such time the Bill shall be Ordered for Second Reading, which order may be called that same day; and

That, in the case of any division relating to any proceedings on the Bill, the division bell shall be limited to 5 minutes.
